Animal laws focus on the behavior of humans rather than the biological reality of animals, and the outcomes of judicial decisions are largely determined by the human connection rather than the impact on the affected animal. Animal laws cover many diverse areas of the law, including contracts, criminal law, torts, property, constitutional law, commercial law, wills and trusts, domestic relations, environmental law, evidence, patent and even tax law. As pets and animals have gained prominence in our society, legislators and courts are struggling to draft and apply animal laws, which historically have viewed animals as property. As scientists increasingly find that non-human animals have consciousness, should that ethically be taken into consideration? This seminar will summarize California and local laws and cover trends that are upending animal welfare.
